Subject: Project Questions

Proponents are advised that Addendum No. 4 is hereby issued. This Addendum will form part of the Request for Proposal.

- 1. Can you please clarify the Town's definition of planning-level costing? For example, is +/- 50% costing an appropriate level?**
 - The Town leaves the definition of planning-level accuracy to the proponent's professional judgment, provided that all assumptions and limitations are clearly documented.
- 2. We note that you followed an Indigenous consultation and collaboration approach for the HRVA. Please can you describe existing relationship with the Yaqan nu?kiy (Lower Kootenay Band), expectations for engagement in this project, and whether you anticipate additional engagement with the other IGBs with potential overlapping traditional territories named in the HRVA?**
 - The Town does not anticipate engagement with other IGBs for this project. In person or online engagement can be provided as options for engagement when seeking feedback.
- 3. Can you please clarify the requirements for the GHG inventory update? The RFP states both "Proponents are not asked to create a new emissions inventory or mitigation plan." and "Updating key datasets where newer information is available (e.g., most recently available CEEI data)."**
 - The RFP does not require proponents to create a new GHG emissions inventory or mitigation plan. Where newer or more recent data is available, such as updated CEEI data, proponents should update the key datasets to ensure the analysis is current. The focus should be on validating, updating, and interpreting existing data to support adaptation planning, rather than duplicating previous work or starting from scratch. Any new data collection should be limited to targeted updates or gap-filling that directly supports adaptation decision-making. Having up-to-date climate data can be useful for understanding actions that both mitigate and contribute to adaptation and resilience.
